NIMS TRAINING & CLASSES

The National Incident Management System (NIMS) provides a common, nationwide approach to enable the whole community to work together to manage all threats and hazards. NIMS applies to all incidents, regardless of cause, size, location, or complexity.

Communities across the Nation experience a diverse set of threats, hazards, and events. The size, frequency, complexity, and scope of these incidents1 vary, but all involve a range of personnel and organizations to coordinate efforts to save lives, stabilize the incident, and protect property and the environment. Every day, jurisdictions and organizations work together to share resources, integrate tactics, and act collaboratively. Whether these organizations are nearby or are supporting each other from across the country, their success depends on a common, interoperable approach to sharing resources, coordinating, and managing incidents, and communicating information.

NIMS guides all levels of government, nongovernmental organizations (NGO), and the private sector to work together to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from incidents. NIMS provides stakeholders across the whole community2 with the shared vocabulary, systems, and processes to successfully deliver the capabilities described in the National Preparedness System.3 NIMS defines operational systems, including the Incident Command System (ICS), Emergency Operations Center (EOC) structures, and Multiagency Coordination Groups (MAC Groups) that guide how personnel work together during incidents. NIMS applies to all incidents, from traffic accidents to major disasters. The jurisdictions and organizations involved in managing incidents vary in their authorities, management structures, communication capabilities and protocols, and many other factors. NIMS provides a common framework to integrate these diverse capabilities and achieve common goals. The guidance contained in this document incorporates solutions developed over decades of experience by incident personnel across the Nation.

If you are already a Firefighter and you do not already have the required NIMS courses listed below, you must complete the NIMS courses prior to the start of the SPFD familiarization Transfer Packet. SCOPE / PURPOSE

A vital part of today's fire service organizations is centered on personnel training. With this in mind, the Stoney Point Fire Department will continue this tradition to provide the best possible training program for probationary recruit personnel entering the fire service.

This standard provides Probationary Firefighters with the minimum training guidelines required by the Stoney Point Fire Department's Training Division. This training program is not a basic certification course. The program intent is to ensure the probationary recruit firefighter meets or exceeds the minimum requirements stipulated by National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 1403 The Standards on Live Fire Training Evolutions, and NFPA 1001 Standard for Firefighter Qualifications (Level I Firefighter).

DEFINITIONS

- 1. **PROBATIONARY RECRUIT FIREFIGHTER** Any member who has not completed the department's orientation-training program.
- 2. **<u>DEFINE</u>** To describe the basic qualities and principles.
- 3. **<u>DEMONSTRATE</u>** To show by actual use.
- 4. **<u>IDENTIFY</u>** Physically select, indicate, or explain verbally or in writing, using standard terms recognized by the fire service.
- 5. **OBJECTIVE** A goal that is achieved through the attainment of a skill, knowledge, or both, which can be observed or measured.
- 6. <u>ACTIVE MEMBER (FIREFIGHTER)</u> Any member who has successfully passed the orientation-training program, including final examinations and practical testing.
- 7. **SHALL** This term indicates a mandatory requirement.
- 8. **TECHNIQUE** The systematic procedure by which a task is accomplished.

GUIDELINES

Upon acceptance as an active member (Volunteer Firefighter or Emergency Medical Technician), each applicant must complete a medical history form and or a medical examination (Physical) along with a physical fitness assessment, which is completed at the Fire Department of this program. All Stoney Point Fire Department personnel shall be given the required immunization for Hepatitis B. This is a three-shot series beginning within 10 days of completion of this program. This is an Occupational Safety & Health Administration (OSHA) mandate per 29 CFR OSHA 1910.1030 Blood borne Pathogens Standard. There will be no deviations from this requirement by any department member All Probationary Firefighters have a <u>6-month period to complete the 1403 Qualification</u> <u>Program Pre-Basic Packet.</u> All Probationary Recruits that do not complete this program within the allotted 6-month period will be released from the department unless there are unique or extenuating circumstances. Extension of the allotted time period must be approved by the Fire Chief.



All Probationary Recruit Firefighters shall be trained and signed off by designated fire department personnel, upon successfully meeting the objectives of this program. All program objectives will be taught and tested to standard. The entire 1403 Qualification Program Pre-Basic Packet is approximately 240 hours in duration. All Firefighters are encouraged to seek further professional development by completing North Carolina Firefighter I & II Classes to obtain certification.

Training classes and scheduled training will be posted on the I AM RESPONDING calendar. The following are the listed training classes and the maximum class hours, pertaining to the Orientation Training Program:

At the conclusion of phase III, a practical and written exam will be given. The probationary recruit firefighter will not advance to firefighter status until they have successfully completed both the written and practical examination. A minimum passing score of 70% is required on the written exam. The Probationary Recruit must successful complete all designated practical exercises. At the completion of the phase III training program the Pre-Basic Coordinator will notify the Training Officer who will administer the written examination. The practical exercises will be scheduled at that time.

The 1403 Qualification Program Pre-Basic Packet is divided into 3 phases to provide a more structured learning environment and to provide achievable goals for the new probationary recruit firefighter.



PHASE I

During this phase, the applicant will complete all required paperwork for department membership and complete the National Incident Management System (NIMS) online courses. Certificate of completion will be printed and placed in the training box located in the radio room. The probationary recruit will be entered into the FIREHOUSE records management system. FIRERESCUE1.COM Training Academy and I AM RESPONDING.

PHASE II

Probationary recruits will be assigned to a duty night, will be issued turnout gear to include a blue TRAINING helmet which identifies them as a non-1403 qualified firefighter. Probationary recruits will successfully complete the following classes:

General/Standard Operating Procedures
Fire Alarm & Communications
Incident Command System (ICS)
Fire Behavior & Portable Extinguishers
Safety
Personal Protective Equipment

PHASE III

The Probationary Recruit firefighters may respond to calls at the discretion of the officer in charge. Once at scene the Probationary Recruit Firefighter **shall not** engage in front line activities (i.e.: operating hose lines, forcible entry, etc.). These personnel shall assist in functional areas such as: rehab, changing air cylinders, and getting needed equipment for the attack crews. The phase III probationary recruit firefighter will assist the engineer until assigned to a support function in the cold zones. The probationary recruit firefighter shall successfully complete the following sections of the program.

Once the probationary recruit firefighter has completed all phase III requirements to standard, they shall notify the Pre-Basic Coordinator (Div. Chief Hanzal) to schedule a time and date for practical and written examinations. This exam shall be administered by the department training officer or his designated representative. The probationary recruit firefighter must achieve a minimum score of 70% on the written exam to be eligible to take the practical exam. The written examination will contain subjects from all phases of this program. Upon successful completion of the written and practical examinations, the firefighter will meet with the Pre-Basic Coordinator to finish any outstanding administrative and/or logistical requirements.

The Fire Chief will present a black fire helmet and a Certificate of Completion to the firefighter during a designated department meeting.


PHASE IV






